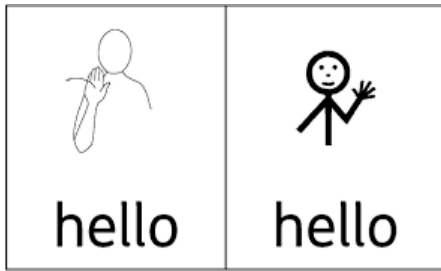


MARCH 2022 NEWSLETTER

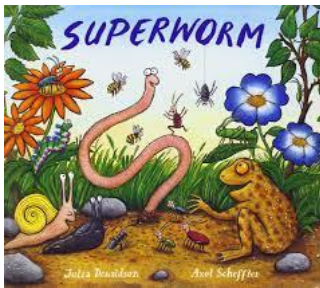


We would like to welcome Karen and Sabrina who will be joining our team. Sabrina has 7 years' experience and holds a Level 3 Early years qualification.

World book day 2022

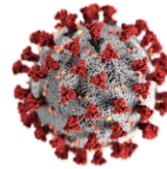
World Book Day was created to celebrate books and authors and encourage young people to discover

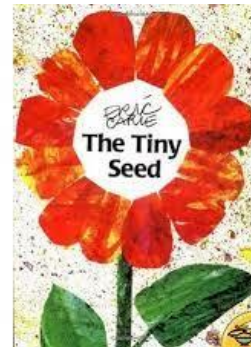

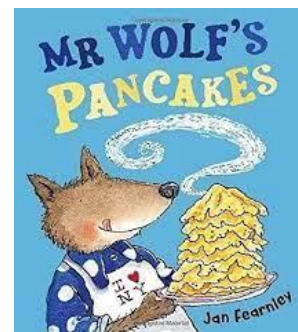

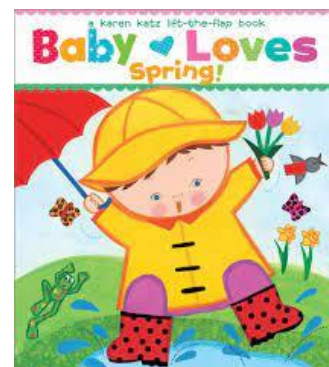
